Mr. Rippy reported that nothing is happening with the purchase agreement that our attorney, Matt Dalton, sent to Park & Rec Districts's attorney

The Board of Director authorized Mr. Rippy to have our attorney, Matt Dalton, move forward with the purchase agreement.

There being no further business to come before the Board, and upon a motion made and carried, the meeting adjourned at 11:00 am.



<u>URSA Development Plan:</u> My understanding is that URSA has submitted their special use permit application to Garfield County and the County staff is reviewing it for completeness. The submittal is reportedly for the development of the A and D pads within the boundaries of the Battlement Mesa PUD. The D pad is located adjacent to Battlement Mesa's Service Center and near the BMMD's river water intake location. I would recommend the Board of Directors consider engaging an engineer to evaluate the pad design and provide comments, concerns or suggestions that should be incorporated to ensure protection of the District's water supply.

<u>Collection & Distribution Maintenance</u>: BMMD staff again repaired the 12" water main adjacent to E. Battlement Parkway this past month. Once again the break was attributable to the original installation that had the main line resting on top of a rock that caused the pipe to rupture. Water service lines were repaired on Hawthorne Way and Limberpine Circle. Crews also replaced a section of the sewer main that had settled in Hackberry Lane.

Retirement - Ted Anderson: The BMMD sponsored a retirement party for long time employee Ted Anderson last week. Ted has worked for the district for 24 years. The party was well attended by community members, board members and contractors that had interacted with Ted during his years of employment with the district. A pocket watch was presented to Ted, on behalf of the BMMD, in appreciation of his years of service.

Staffing Changes: With the retirement of Ted Anderson, David Beecraft has been promoted to fill the Utility Foreman position which was previously filled by Ted. We have advertised for the Utility Tech position in order to fill the position vacated by David's promotion. To date we have received 32 applications and hope to begin conducting interviews in the next week or two.
